Imagine that one day you receive an angry telephone call from an electronic store, demanding that you pay thousands of dollars in bills for an expensive washing machine. The only problem is, you've never bought anything from that store. You apparently have been the victim of identity theft, the fastest growing crime in the world. Identity theft happens when thieves steal your personal information and pretend to be you, usually so that they can purchase expensive stuff or commit other forms of fraud. Identity theft is often invisible, and the damage **it** brings about can take years to fix.

Identity theft is spreading rapidly for many reasons. Firstly, people resist laws that would make credit cards safer. They prefer convenience to safety. Secondly, the growing popularity of shopping online has created many new dangers. Thieves can steal your information effortlessly through fake web pages, emails, and other tricks. Later, they can sign back on to the Internet and anonymously buy things online, without the risk of using a fake card in person. Thirdly, owing to the Internet and cell phones, identity thieves can steal personal information from people in different countries, making it almost impossible for them to be found and arrested.

The good news is that there are several easy things you can do to protect yourself. If you get a strange call from a bank or company asking you for information, just hang up immediately. Then check the company's published number or web page, and request to speak to its service department. That way you can be certain the person you are talking to is not a fraud. In addition, be sure you tore all documents before throwing them into the garbage can. Lastly, don't forget to check your credit reports and immediately report any suspicious charges.

第二篇：

There was a time when Nintendo ruled the world of video games. In recent years, however, rival products from Sony and Microsoft pushed Nintendo out of the top spot. But Nintendo is fighting back, with its second gaming revolution.

Interestingly, "Revolution" was the company's code name for its new-generation gaming console(虛擬遊戲平台). The product hit stores in the US and Japan in late 2006, and in Taiwan more recently, with the name Wii, which is pronounced "we," and the two i's may represent the long, thin shapes of its remote controller and its console. Successfully, Nintendo has reinvented video gaming with this console.

What sets the Wii apart from previous consoles and from its competitors is its wireless controller, the Wii Remote, which can be used as a handheld pointing device and detect movement in three dimensions. Instead of a bulky gamepad covered in buttons, the Wii Remote, nicknamed "Wiimote," has a slim stick that resembles a TV remote control. A player can hold the Wiimote differently depending on the game, for example, grasping it like the hilt of a sword or like a baseball bat. The Wii has changed the gaming experience significantly by allowing players to physically interact with the virtual world. So you become part of the game, since your movements are copied by your character on screen. If your game involves sword fighting and you want your character to swing his/her sword, you swing the Wiimote yourself. Because of a speaker and force-feedback device built into the Wiimote, you will hear a "clang" when your character's sword hits another sword on the screen.

The physical interaction of players with the Wii sets this system apart from those of Nintendo's competitors. Perhaps this is another explanation for the name Wii: its sound—"we"—emphasizes participation.
